I thought I would never be more glad

rise than this week. Do you have any  
idea what the sunshine in springtime can  
do? The birds chirping merrily away, the

sounds, feelings and sights of spring. Just  
to take my coat off was a welcomed  
pleasure, like lifting all my burdens  
away. There is even statistical evidence  
that the sun can warm the heart of a  
criminal. Violent crime rates go down  
when there is a period of sunshine. What  
a great thing it is, this sunshine. For  
without it, there would not be any sign  
of life anywhere.

Everytime I think of a sunny day I  
cannot help but be reminded of the sun-  
shine of my soul, Jesus Christ. What the  
sun is to our physical environment, so  
is Christ in my soul. In the first chapter  
of John we see the amazing parallel,  
"Eternal life is in him, and this life gives  
light to all mankind. His life is the light  
that shines through the darkness, and  
the darkness can never extinguish it."

I bask in the warmth of that light. The  
warmth Christ gives me is his love. Even  
when clouds may gather and we can't  
see the sun, it is still warm. We know  
of the sun's presence not just because
